Life History of the child and the reason for sponsorship:

Since the occupation of Tibet, thousands of Tibetan fled Tibet and embarked on an arduous and perilous journey into exile. Subsequently, they took refuge in India, Nepal, and Bhutan. Inherently, the life of refugees is that of struggle, plagued by impoverishment and uncertain future. Nevertheless, under the guidance and aegis of His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama, it was decided that "Education" holds the key to preserving and sustaining the Tibetan struggle for a longer time. Therefore, separate schools for the Tibetan children were established under the administration of the Department of Education, CTA. The DoE is the apex body that has the mandate to give guidance and oversee the education of the entire Tibetan community in exile. On 16th May 1999, DoE started a new organization (Sambhota Tibetan Schools Society) that would manage the schools which were erstwhile managed directly by the DoE. Sambhota primarily provides education in far-flung areas, providing wholesome education to those less privileged.

Mingyur Yeshi hails from a far-flung region named Chandragiri, Odisha. STS Chandragiri is an English medium school and has classes from class VI to X. Moreover, the primary livelihood of the family over there is either farming, army or winter sweater seller. His father works as a manual labour while his mother is a housewife. His father works on daily wage basis, hence, no steady stream of income. The meager income generated by his father just sufficed to cover their daily necessities, let alone covering their son school fees. They want their son to study well and become self-reliant and independent unlike themselves.

Mingyur is an ambivert, kind and intelligent child who is fond of playing basketball and videogames. Further, he is fond of spending time with her friends and siblings. Physically, he is a well-developed child and is fond of his mother. His parent wants him to study well and become not only a contributing member of our exiled Tibetan community but the world at large. Additionally, his favorite food is meat dumpling (momo) while blue and black is his favorite colour. He aspires to become a doctor and his favourite subject is Science. His humble parent has a huge expectation from him and wishes to see him succeed unlike themselves. If he studies well, he can potentially change the poor lifestyle of his family.

We assure you that, we will keep you posted and updated about the child twice a year, covering his progress in academic and co-curricular activities. Your kind support will encourage and enable these underprivileged children in playing an instrumental role in the development of their community. We the entire staff members and the children would like to thank you for your unwavering support tnow, we have made good progress till now, but are also aware that there are still more grounds to cover, so to achieve that we continually require your both physical and moral support.
